I am sending the enclosed 11 poems to be
offered with the Parmer Bride, to Messrs
Macmillan for publication as a new
book in America under the title of
Saturday Market. I am pleased to
know you think it possible they may
reconsider their decision of last March.
If, however, they will not do so, could
not the book be offered to one or two
other American publishers before
the idea of a simultaneous edition
is abandoned?

Perhaps, under
the new conditions, Mr. Hargrave Phillips
might again be willing to take it
or would Putnam consider it?

I shall be sorry if this last opportunity of
an American edition should be missed
together with chances now gone by; but
I still hope that if not Macmillan,
some other American publisher may
~~take~~ either take over the red sheet
or consider a new edition. If not
I suppose it is possible that one day
or other some one may publish it
without consulting us?
