

Black Student Union Officers Charged in UB Disruption

 Four members of the Black A UNIVERSITY spokesman Student Union at the State said members of the Black University of Buffalo were charged Tuesday with disrupting a meeting of the Student Assembly, the governing body for UB undergraduates.

 The charge was filed by Student Association officers with the university's Commission on Campus Disorders, an organization of students, faculty and staff which hears charges in campus disorders and then makes recommendations to the president who takes final action.

 A hearing on the charge is expected in 10 to 15 days. The names of the students charged were not released.

 The disruption charge followed a meeting of the Student Assembly Monday concerning the budget requests of student organizations for next school year.

 STUDENT Association officers filed the disruption charge Tuesday and UB campus security officers delivered the charges to the four students at a closed meeting of Black Student Union members and black faculty in Hayes Hall.

 The 30 persons at the meeting then went to UB President Robert L. Ketter to protest the delivery of the charges at the closed meeting.
