

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT made this day of ...*February 18th 1916.*
between Charlotte Mary Mew of 9 Gordon Street, Gordon Square, W.C.
hereinafter termed the Author) of the one part, and Harold Monro, of
35 Devonshire Street, Theobalds Road, W.C., carrying on business under
the firm name of "The Poetry Bookshop" of 35 Devonshire Street,
Theobalds Road, W.C. Publishers and Booksellers(hereinafter termed
the Publisher) of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed
between the parties hereto for themselves and their respective
executors, administrators, and assigns(or successors, as the case may
be), as follows:-

1. The Publisher shall at his own risk and expense, and with
due diligence, produce and publish in the Spring of 1916
the work at present entitled "The Farmers Bride" by
Charlotte Mew, in Chapbook form at the price of one
shilling net, or such price as may be hereafter agreed
upon between the Author and the Publisher, and shall
use his best endeavours to sell the same.
2. The Publisher agrees to pay the Author the following
royalties, that is to say:-
(a) A royalty of one penny on each and all copies sold.
(b) In the event of the publisher disposing of copies
or editions at a reduced rate for sale in the
United States, or elsewhere, or as remainders, a
royalty of ten per cent(10%) of the amount realised
by such sale, in lieu and instead of the aforesaid
royalty of one penny.
No royalties shall be paid on any copies given away
for review or other purposes.
3. The Publisher shall have the entire control of the
publication and sale and terms of sale of the book
during a period of five years from the date of
publication, throughout the World, and the Author shall
not during the continuance of this agreement (without
the consent of the Publisher) publish any abridgement,
translation, or dramatised version of the work.
4. The Author agrees that all costs of corrections and
alterations (other than printers errors) in the proof
sheets exceeding ten shillings shall be deducted from
the royalties payable to her.
5. In the case of the use of quotations or selections
from the said book in anthologies and otherwise the
fees received in payment for such rights shall be
divided between the parties to this agreement in the
proportion of seventyfive per cent.(75%) to the Author
and twentyfive per cent.(25%) to the Publisher.
6. The Author shall be entitled to six(6) copies of the
said book free of charge and to such further number
of copies as she may require for her use (but not for
sale) at trade rates.
7. The accounts shall be truly and faithfully kept and
made up every six months, to the thirtieth day of June
and the thirtyfirst day of December in each year, and
payment is to be made to the author of all sums due
to her under this agreement within one month from the
date of rendering of each account.
